Promoting a Culture of Experimentation Across Your Company

The Microsoft Garage is more than an innovation program or physical spaces: it's "the growth mindset made real". The Garage is a worldwide program that serves as a catalyst for cultural change and a way for employees and interns to follow their curiosity and passion for projects as experiments.

In his presentation, Mike will share his insights how The Microsoft Garage helps fuel innovation through:

- Organizing a Global Hackathon each year for the entire company to participate in, and promoting hacking 52 weeks a year
- Running an "Experimental Outlet" where small teams can test their hypotheses, evaluate feasibility, and do early customer tests quickly
- Helping employees learn more about business as well as how to become more agile and responsive to customer feedback

Mike will also share reflections on the challenges associated with experimentation within large companies while looking for the next big leap forward, as well as learnings from this year's Global Hackathon, which was the first to be run virtually worldwide by The Garage team.

Instilling Agile Mindsets, Leadership, and Ways of Working

Alfred is the Head of Mechanical Engineering & Manufacturing at Level 5, Lyft's self-driving division and he is responsible for leading the detailed design, development, and assembly of Lyft's autonomous vehicles. In this presentation, Alfred will share his insights on:

- How to instil a mindset that embraces autonomy, learning, and failure. Encouraging experimentations
 and sometimes even helping accelerate failure to get to the learning and evolve as a team quicker.
 Rapidly digesting failures and taking mental and/or physical notes to better identify and solve future
 roadblocks more efficiently. Taking risks and walking through various potential failure modes while also
 preparing mitigation plans for them.
- Creating simple roadmaps with realistic priorities, setting the groundwork for expectations with deliverables and not constantly seeking perfection. Setting micro-milestones to take small iterative steps as well as taking advantage of parallel initiatives, different resources, and tools such as 3D printing, virtual verification, rapid prototyping.
- Ensuring strong engagement, synergy, and collaboration between cross-functional teams, by frequently
 auditing progress and obtaining feedback and expertise to promote transparency and inclusion and
 maintain agility and speed, especially amidst Covid-19.
